    - iii. Council for community engagement – help address health disparities and poverties in San Francisco. Woman from Do Not Harm initiative came to talk about UCSF investments in energy companies invested in DAPL. There is no labor/union representatives that sit on board that decides where UCSF investments go. UCSF sustainability goals not in line with investment DAPL. There was a UC student-driven initiative that lead to divestment in PIC previously

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1. Should we choose to create a policy or letter to discuss this?
  2. Addressed in President Napolitano Meeting at Council of UC Presidents. Something she mentioned – delicacy of the issue that people’s money is involved – slow because one aspect is being mindful of the fact that we can’t just take money out (people’s life savings are involved, you have to be systematic with how you draw out money and choosing to invest in new companies). Keep in mind retirement funds are in a conglomerate of companies, 30 of them are invested in DAPL. (Energy Transfer Companies invested in DAPL)
  3. We as GPSA can write a letter to UCSA for them to use.

    1. Library has double the funding of last year, \$90k total. New initiative is to give up to a \$1000 dollars for groups submitting manuscripts to open access journals, publicize the initiative.

    1. No update
  - viii. Student Health Advisory Committee
    1. Clarification on renewal being voted on by April 15<sup>th</sup>. 7.6% renewal rate increase for 2016-2017, will be similar for this year’s renewal.
  - ix. Student Services Fee Advisory Committee
    1. Last meeting last week – went over allocations diff. organizations met... had groups come in and talk about how they use their fees for spending + discussed structure for group next year. 5% increase per year (set in 2015-2016) to meet mental health improvement... After 5<sup>th</sup> year (2020), unknown how much fees will increase for spending on mental health until closer to that year.
    2. Recommendations for new model – committee would only like to see budget for new proposal. Designated spot for each school division. Limit meetings on years where there’s no new proposals. Recommend that current standardized format for proposal template is good as is.
