Resident tuition will increase by 2.7% and the proposal was to increase non-resident tuition by an additional 0.8%, to 3.5%. This would effect undergraduates only
 - 2. UCSF can vote for, against, or abstain from voting. General consensus was that since we do not have an undergraduate campus it would be appropriate to abstain from this vote.
