III. NEW BUSINESS / ACTION (5:40-5:55)

- A. Safe Disposal of Medications Survey – Yaser Khoshal & Hugo Aguilar
 - a. Not present
- B. 10th Annual LGBTQIA+ Health Forum – Irving Ling
 - a. Will be held February 24th, location TBD. Event including workshops, classes, and keynote speaker Janet Mock, writer, TV host, and transgender rights activist. Publicity efforts so far include social media and email listserves.
 - b. Attendance expected: 400 attendees (up to 500 if held at Mission Bay), 200-250 of which will be students
 - i. Registration costs: \$15 for students, \$25 for community members
 - c. Seeking \$6000 in funding from GPSA
 - i. Total event cost: \$33,600
 - ii. Other sources of funding: Deans Office, Chancellors Endowment Fund, matching funds from Student Academic Affairs
 - iii. Alternatives if funding not received: alumni association, external (non-UCSF) sources, reduction of food costs by donation from local businesses – has not been done in the past
 - iv. Funding needed to cover food, AV tech support, and honorariums for workshop panelists and speakers

 - a. Will invite to come speak at GPSA meeting in January or February
 - b. Applications due towards end of February. Two applications: one for a 2-year position (graduate or undergrad) and one as “advisor” (this year only undergraduates are eligible)

 - a. Committee Updates
 - i. Alumni Association: Retreat meeting in January, no new updates
 - ii. Campus Climate, Culture, and Inclusion: Discussed the results of the 2017 faculty climate survey. Although the majority of faculty are satisfied with the campus climate, when subcategories were looked into, such as women or minority groups, people surveyed in those populations felt as though there were disparities. The majority opinion masked the actual groups that were affected. Many faculty do not realize there is an issue, leading to a push for UCSF to be more transparent on issues moving forward.

 - iv. Center for Community Engagement – no new updates

 - v. Chancellor’s Campus Council -no new updates
