- G. Pharmacy Representative –Rosalind Tom
 - a. ASSP has changed funding model accordingly due to changes in GPSA funding model. Requests by RCOs go to school specific government first, must be referred to GPSA to request additional funding. Starting July 2018, will fund all RCOs, not just those under ASSP
 - b. RCOs are reducing the number of elected positions to better accommodate SOP's transition to a 3-year block schedule program. Number of students per cohort reduced from 126 to 96.
 - c. No announcements permitted on Facebook any longer – all organizations who would like to advertise to SOP must submit a request through ASSP or OrgSync to be included in the announcement email
- H. Dentistry Representative – Taranvir Cheema
 - a. New dean: Dr. Kirkland. Restructuring in progress, as Dr. Kirkland was formerly the international student dean, and that position will need to be filled.
