- a. Funding request for the Interprofessional Violence Prevention conference held October 2018
 - b. Purpose of event: Educating future healthcare providers on the spectrum of violence and how it relates to their patients & practice. Includes a keynote speaker, breakout sessions, and training for each profession individually
 - c. Had previously requested funding from GPSA in 2014 for \$575 and wanted to renew the ask. Fundraising for \$15k total to host conference – covers logistics, food for participants, rental cost of Cole Hall, supplies for participants. Event is open to students, faculty, staff, community
 - d. Vote to approve \$600 in funding: 8 voted for, 0 against, 0 abstain
 - i. Funding request approved with the recommendation to include a grad student in event planning, include sessions for grad division during the event, advertise on Mission Bay campus
